

Tobin and Liane Rockley of Rockley Music Center and The Rockley Family Foundation Advocates for Music Education at Four-Day Event in Washington, D.C.

On Capitol Hill, the Rockley's re-enforced importance of new federal law and its inclusion of music education for all children

Lakewood, CO May 31, 2016 – Tobin and Liane Rockley, area business leaders, joined 91 music industry leaders and artists to advocate that all children deserve quality, comprehensive music education programs in their schools during the four-day National Association of Music Merchants' (NAMM) Music Education Advocacy D.C. Fly-In event in Washington D.C. on May 23 – 26, 2016.

With the recent passage of the federal education law, the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), the delegation met with their Members of Congress to reinforce the importance of music being listed as part of a well-rounded education for all children at the State-level.

"Every child needs music and the arts as part of a well-rounded education, said Liane Rockley. "Arts education gives all children the opportunity for self-expression, stress relief and just plain fun! It is monumental that our Congress was able to put aside their differences and reach across the aisle to get this passed."

The Advocacy week began with a Day of Service where members from the group, including New York Yankee-turned Latin GRAMMY-nominated guitarist Bernie Williams, donated musical instruments and accessories and provided three hours of music lessons taught by master teachers of the drum, ukulele and guitar to students at D.C.'s Friendship Technology Preparatory Academy.

The Rockley's participated in advocacy training at Nelson Mullins – a premier national law firm based in Washington D.C., - during which they were briefed on the current issues facing public school music programs, ESSA and the current political climate. The Rockley's were also trained on how to develop state-level advocacy efforts for music and arts education in Colorado.

The Rockley's met with Senator Gardner (R-CO), Senator Bennet's (D-CO) office, Congressman Perlmutter (D - CO) and Congressman Polis (D-CO) about the importance of music education and the support needed to insure that each student has the opportunity to learn music in school – a message that the Rockley Family will continue to advocate for at home.

In addition to the advocacy work, the Rockley's were a part of a special welcoming committee for Turnaround Arts, a program under the President's Committee on the Arts and Humanities. At a reception held on Tuesday, May 24, the Rockley's honored a variety of artists, including **Smokey Robinson**, **Alfre Woodard**, **John Lloyd Young**, **Carla Dirlikov**, **Keb' Mo'**, among others, for their work in arts education advocacy. Each artist was recognized with a SupportMusic Award from The NAMM Foundation for his or her
